The aim of FELTAG was to identify the structural and cultural inhibitors to innovation in the use of technology to enhance learning and to improve learning outcomes. The interrelated recommendations were designed to remove these inhibitors and 'nudge' the Further Education system towards a digital future now expected by learners and employers.







Activity B: Horizon scan

Under the headings of Teaching & Learning Technologies, IAG, and Digital Infrastructure, use the horizon scan report to work with your team and identify:



- The priority technologies to meet the needs of your learners and your organisation
- Which learning technologies you currently have in place
- Which learning technologies you are planning to have in place
- Where there are gaps

Then use Activity D to help develop any identified gaps or build on strengths.






Activity C: Horizon scan

Activity D: Development toolkit
