

Foreword

In 2008/09, LSIS undertook a number of projects for the DCSF, looking at career learning, information, advice and guidance (CLIAG) for young people in the further education sector.

This work involved discussions with a wide range of people from across the FE sector as well as an in-depth look at the research that has been conducted into this topic over the last few years. The results have been used to produce a series of reports for the sector and others with an interest in the topic. It became clear that CLIAG is a leadership issue and that leaders in the sector need to address how their organisation can deliver this support effectively to gain maximum benefits for young people and their organisation.

This publication provides information on resources that providers might find useful to support the delivery of careers learning information, advice and guidance for young people in further education. In December 2008, we consulted a wide range of providers to ask for their help in identifying resources that they would recommend; these include books, directories, classroom materials and software.

Whilst the focus of the study has been primarily on the 14-19 age group, many of the resources will be useful when working with learners of all ages.

Introduction

This document contains a list of current resources relating to careers information, advice and guidance. It is separated into tables of resources under headings to help you identify what you might find useful. Each table shows the title of the resource, a brief description of information contained within and suggested user group, publisher, publishing date, ISBN and price. You will find that many suppliers will give discount on such materials.

This is a list of resources that are current and available to buy, but is not exhaustive. Those annotated with a tick have been recommended by practitioners currently working with young people in further education, and practitioners' comments are included. Many producers of careers-related resources, and independent suppliers, produce catalogues. These invariably list additional resources; however, many tend not to fall within the recommended lifespan of a careers resource.

The general guideline for currency of publications is that resources containing 'hard' information (i.e. salaries, number of available course or training places, and statistics) should be kept for no longer than two years. Materials containing 'soft' information (i.e. general job descriptions and other such information that is less likely to date), may be kept for longer, but ideally no longer than three years.

The exceptions to these rules are some careers education programmes and classroom materials, that are not updated more regularly, and where materials can be used and adapted as necessary over time. Some special educational needs (SEN) materials also tend to be retained, as again these are updated less often. Where materials are older than the suggested ruling above, it is recommended that a sticker is placed on the front cover stating, "Although this publication is over two years old, some of the information contained may still be useful".

The resources listed in this document can be purchased from a variety of retailers. Some books can be bought from high street booksellers, and most through online suppliers such as Amazon.

Many publishers will also supply their own titles, and these can be ordered by telephone or through the web. If you prefer to buy direct from a publisher, you should search on their website or ring them direct to see if this is possible. Another method that many organisations choose to use is to order all required resources through a main supplier. Three of the bigger companies offering this service are:

All three suppliers offer online order systems.

The guide does not list websites for careers information, advice and guidance. There are thousands of websites available, although not all are accurate or up to date. The easiest way to search for websites is to use a search engine, such as Google, for reliable web searches of reputable, informative and up-to-date information it is suggested that Careers Comp@nion, an online portal (listed p46), is purchased.
