Citizenship creates opportunities for students to become actively engaged in projects that help to shape their communities, to make change and to make a difference. The process builds self-esteem and confidence as well as embedding knowledge, skills and understanding.

Opportunities for active citizenship are created through other curriculum areas. Eg.

In PSHE lessons we were learning about the role of the NHS and the services it provides—the active citizenship element was our participation in a local campaign to challenge proposed changes to our local hospital.




In R.E. lessons we learnt about the role of charities the active citizenship element was to plan and organise an assembly and fund raising day for unicef.

As well as teaching citizenship as a discrete subject we have tried to embed it into many other subjects. In this way the whole ethos of empowerment encourages our students to be assertive, challenging, thoughtful and caring citizens.
